Getting Started:

- Gather all materials needed.
- Trim all zip strips and set aside. The zip strip is the ½" accent paper along the top of each sheet of patterned paper.
- Check the cut orientation below each cutting guide image. This will show you how to cut the paper, keeping the patterns on your project pieces facing the right direction.
- Light grey pieces on your cutting guide are project pieces. White pieces are leftover paper.
- As you cut the paper, label and sort the pieces as indicated in the cutting guide, creating a stack for each project.
- If there is a fold line present in a cutting diagram, cut the paper first before folding it. In order to die-cut two shapes at once, place the die on top of the folded paper or stack two paper pieces before running the paper through your die-cutting machine. Paper pieces that can be stacked for die-cutting will be labeled, "stack."

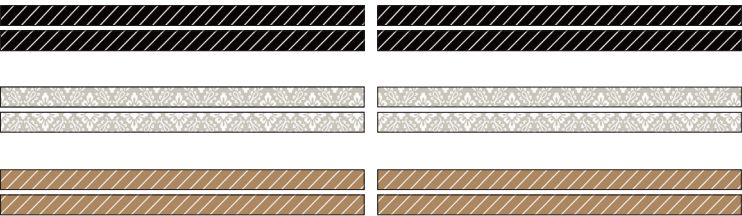

 ■ = suggested Thin Cuts arrangement

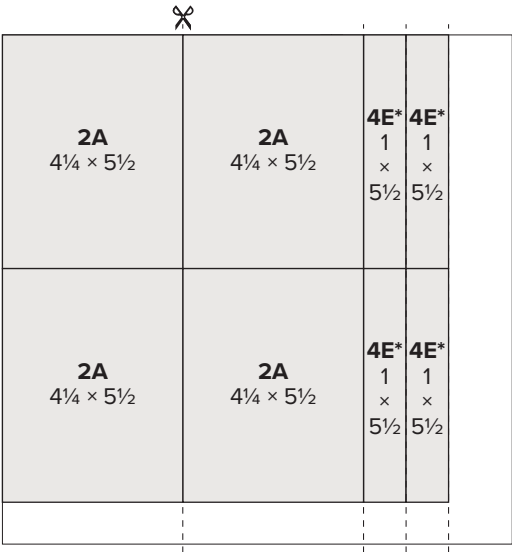

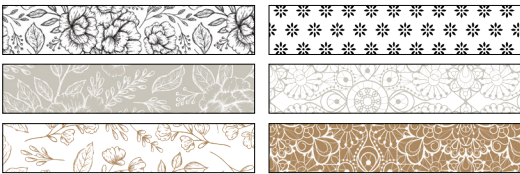

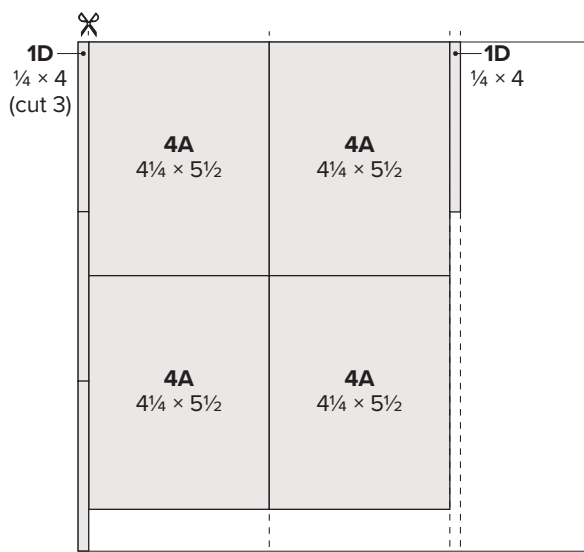

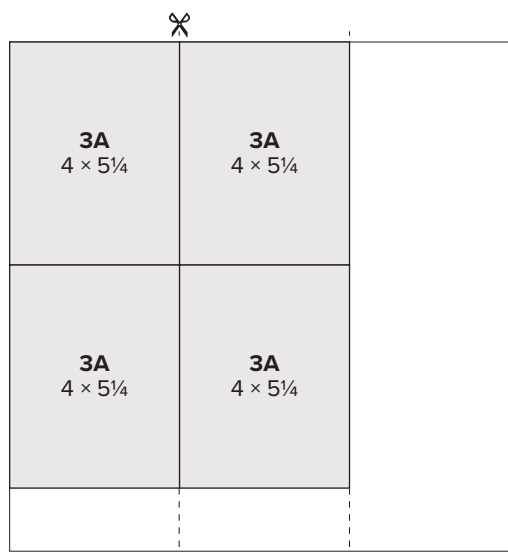


Sangria cardstock

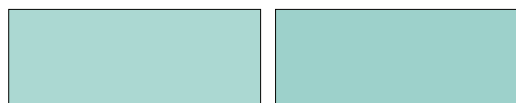

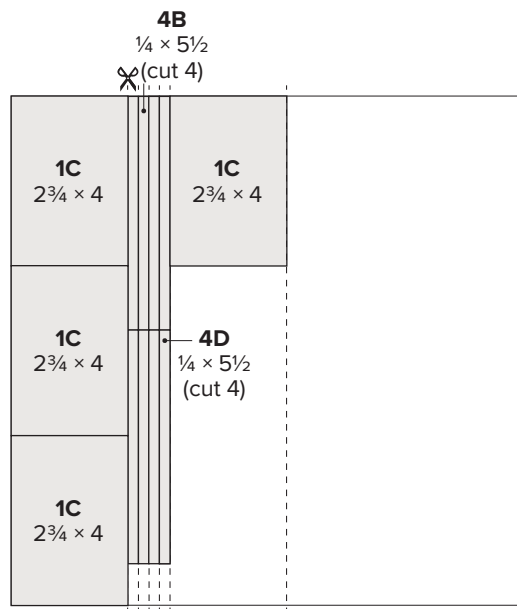


Glacier cardstock

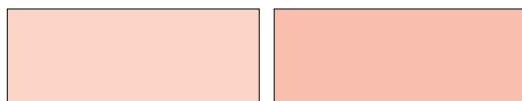

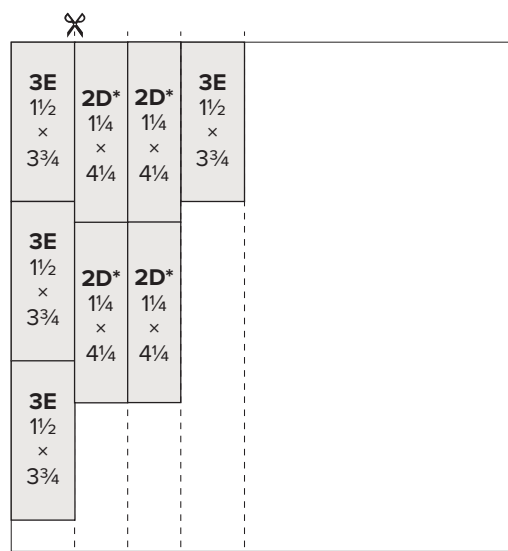


Peach cardstock

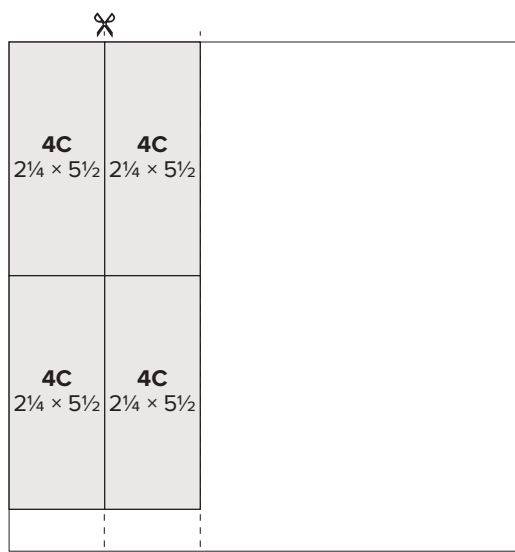


Evergreen cardstock

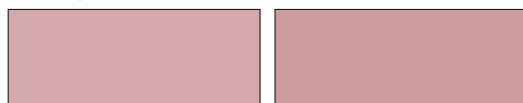

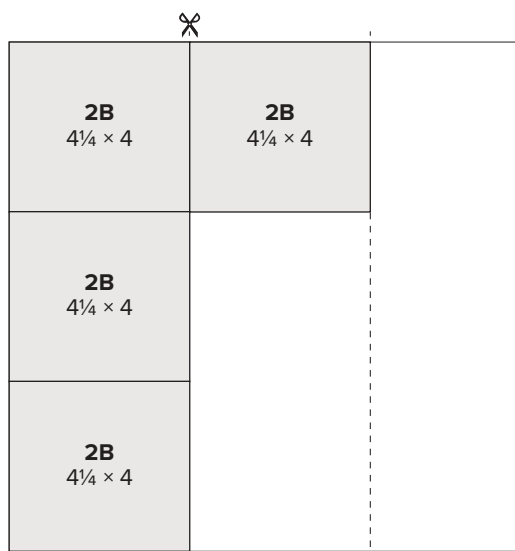


Papaya cardstock

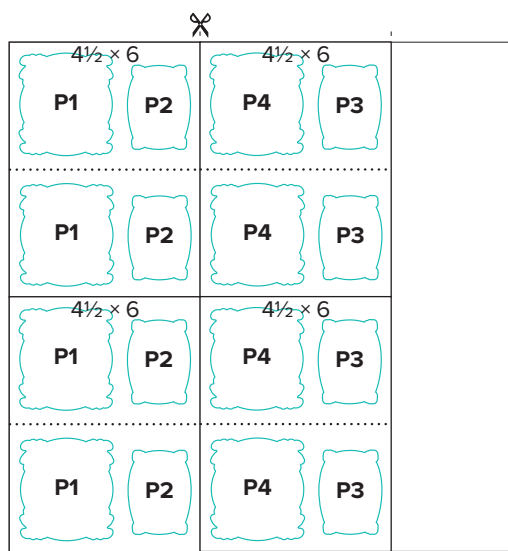

Project 1: Make 4



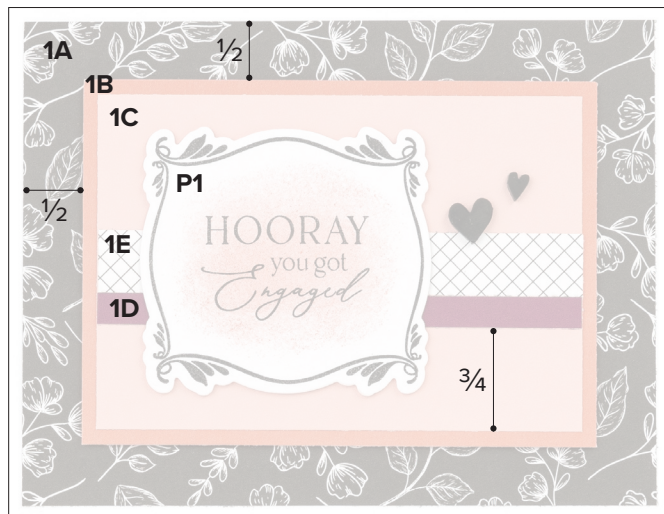
Prepare (4):

Tips: If you are creating the Mink cards, replace the Intense Black ink with Pewter ink. If you are creating the Toffee cards, replace the Intense Black ink with Toffee ink.

- Stamp large frame and “HOORAY you got Engaged” on P1 White Daisy cardstock accent with Intense Black ink (or Pewter or Toffee ink)
- Lightly sponge over the sentiment on accent with Papaya ink
Tip: Cut a wedge out of the round sponge and use it to apply the ink.

Technique: Gently rub the sponge on the ink pad and then lightly pounce it on the cardstock until the desired amount of color is achieved.

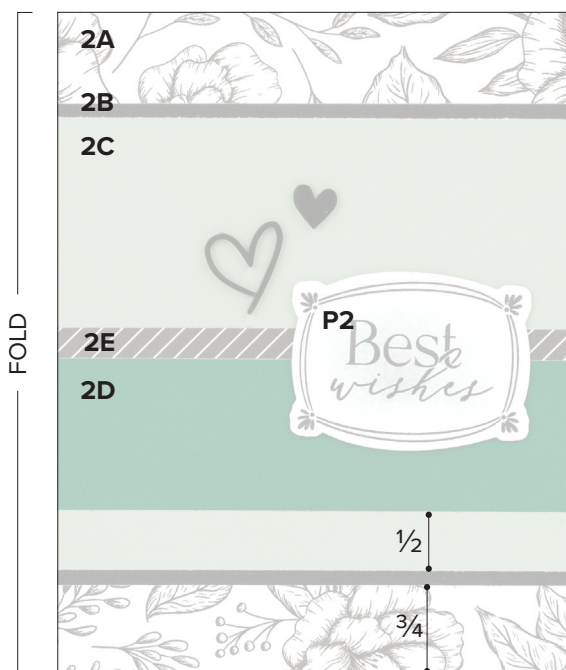
FOLD



Assemble:

1. Attach 1A
2. Attach 1B with thin 3-D foam tape
3. Attach 1C
4. Attach 1D and 1E
5. Attach prepared frame accent with thin 3-D foam tape, as shown
6. Embellish with hearts
Tip: Attach with glue dots.

Project 2: Make 4



Prepare (4):

Tips: If you are creating the Mink cards, replace the Intense Black ink with Pewter ink. If you are creating the Toffee cards, replace the Intense Black ink with Toffee ink.

- Stamp small frame and "Best Wishes" on P2 White Daisy cardstock accent with Intense Black ink (or Pewter or Toffee ink), as shown
- Lightly sponge over sentiment on accent with Glacier ink, as shown

Tip: Cut a wedge out of the round sponge and use it to apply the ink.

Technique: Gently rub the sponge on the ink pad and then lightly pounce it on the cardstock until the desired amount of color is achieved.

Assemble:

1. Attach 2A
2. Attach 2B
3. Attach 2C
4. Attach 2D and 2E
5. Attach prepared frame accent with thin 3-D foam tape, as shown
6. Embellish with hearts

Tip: Attach with glue dots.

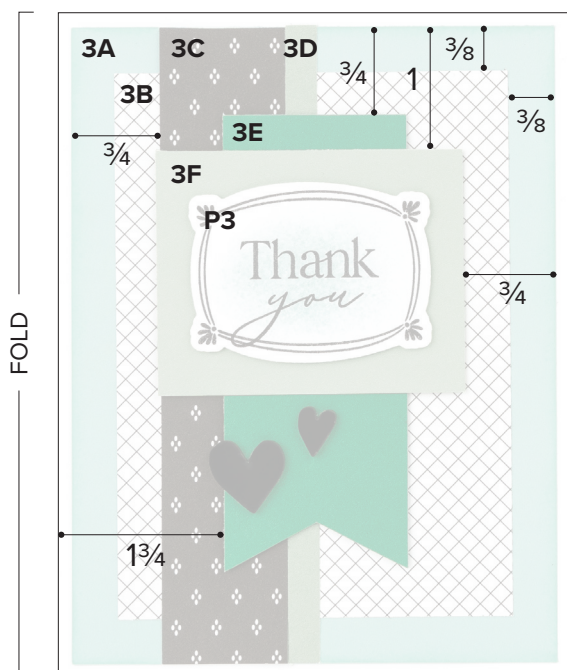
Project 3: Make 4



Prepare (4):

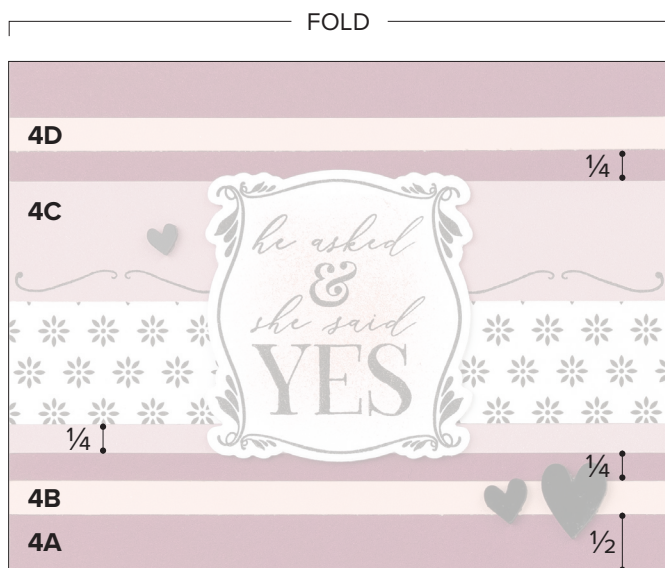
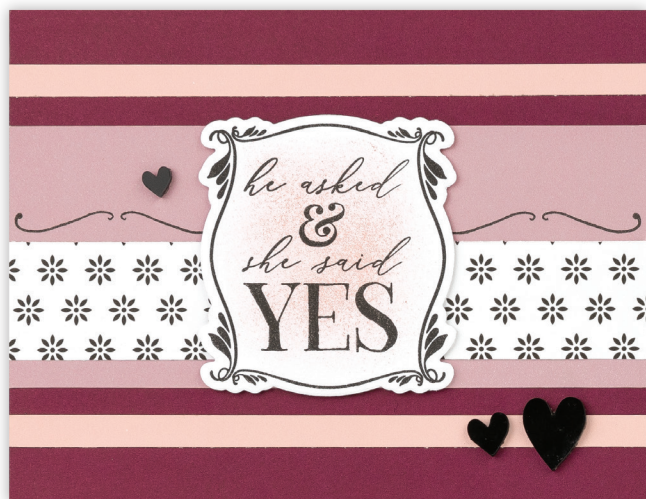
- Sponge edges of 3A with Glacier ink
Tip: Cut a wedge out of the round sponge and use it to apply the ink.
Technique: Gently rub the sponge on the ink pad and then lightly pounce it on the cardstock until the desired amount of color is achieved.
- Stamp small frame and “Thank you” on P3 White Daisy cardstock accent with Intense Black ink (or Pewter or Toffee), as shown
- Lightly sponge over sentiment on accent with Glacier ink, as shown



Assemble:

1. Attach prepared 3A
2. Attach 3B
3. Attach 3C and 3D
4. Dovetail and attach 3E with thin 3-D foam tape
5. Attach 3F with thin 3-D foam tape
6. Attach prepared frame accent with thin 3-D foam tape, as shown
7. Embellish with hearts
Tip: Attach with glue dots.

Project 4: Make 4



Prepare (4):

Tips: If you are creating the Mink cards, replace the Intense Black ink with Pewter ink. If you are creating the Toffee cards, replace the Intense Black ink with Toffee ink.

- Stamp large frame and “he asked & she said YES” on P4 White Daisy cardstock accent with Intense Black ink (or Pewter or Toffee), as shown
- Lightly sponge over sentiment on accent with Papaya ink, as shown

Tip: Cut a wedge out of the round sponge and use it to apply the ink.

Technique: Gently rub the sponge on the ink pad and then lightly pounce it on the cardstock until the desired amount of color is achieved.

Assemble:

1. Attach 4A
2. Attach 4B, 4C, and 4D
3. Attach 4E
4. Stamp flourishes on 4C with Intense Black ink (or Pewter or Toffee), as shown
5. Attach prepared frame accent with thin 3-D foam tape, as shown
6. Embellish with hearts

Tip: Attach with glue dots.
