## Getting Started:

- Gather all materials needed.
- Trim all zip strips and set aside. The zip strip is the $1 / 2$ " accent paper along the top of each sheet of patterned paper.
- Check the cut orientation below each cutting guide image. This will show you how to cut the paper, keeping the patterns on your project pieces facing the right direction.
- Light grey pieces on your cutting guide are project pieces. White pieces are leftover paper.
- As you cut the paper, label and sort the pieces as indicated in the cutting guide, creating a stack for each project.
- If there is a fold line present in a cutting diagram, cut the paper first before folding it. In order to die-cut two shapes at once, place the die on top of the folded paper or stack two paper pieces before running the paper through your die-cutting machine. Paper pieces that can be stacked for die-cutting will be labeled, "stack."

Prepare (for both pages):


- Stamp patterns on P1 cardstock circle parts with Avocado, Glacier, and Lagoon inks, as shown




## Assemble:

1. Use light Linen cardstock for base page
2. Attach P1 circle parts to form top and bottom rows Tip: The circles in each column are approximately $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}-3 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ apart.
3. Attach remaining P1 circles and circle parts, as shown. Tip: Lay these pieces out before attaching, matching the pieces along the left edge with those on the right edge of the left page.
4. Attach 1 H to 1 G
5. Tear approx. $1 / 4$ " off $1 G$, as shown, and attach
6. Attach 11
7. Draw stitch lines on 1J with journaling pen, and attach
8. Attach 1 K with 3-D foam tape
9. Attach photo
10. Embellish with acrylic shapes Tip: Attach with glue dots.
11. Add journaling

Project 2: Left Page


## Prepare (for both pages):

- Stamp patterns on P2 cardstock circle parts with Avocado, Glacier, and Lagoon inks, as shown

- Stamp polka dot pattern on 2B, 2C, and 2K with Avocado ink, as shown

- Stamp polka dot pattern on 2 Q with Glacier ink, as shown



## Assemble:

1. Use light Lagoon cardstock for base page
2. Draw border on 2A with journaling pen, as shown
3. Attach 2A
4. Attach background P2 circle and circle parts, as shown Tips: Lay all these pieces out before attaching. The circles in each row are approx. $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ apart.
5. Attach prepared 2B and 2C
6. Attach 2 E to 2 D
7. Attach 2D
8. Attach 2 F

Tip: Do not use adhesive along the left edge so another piece can be tucked behind it in a later step.
9. Dovetail and attach 2G with 3-D foam tape Tip: Do not use adhesive along the top right corner so another piece can be tucked behind it in a later step.
10. Attach remaining P2 die cut accents, as shown

Tip: Tuck a few of these pieces slightly behind 2F and 2G.
11. Attach photos
12. Embellish with acrylic shapes Tip: Attach with glue dots.
13. Add journaling


## Assemble:

1. Use light Lagoon cardstock for base page
2. Draw border on 2 H with journaling pen
3. Attach 2 H
4. Attach background P2 circle and circle parts, as shown Tips: Lay all these out before attaching. The circles in each row are approx. $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ apart.
5. Attach 2I, 2J, and prepared 2 K
6. Attach $2 \mathrm{~L}, 2 \mathrm{M}$, and 2 N with 3-D foam tape Tip: Do not use adhesive along the top right of $2 M$ so another piece can be tucked behind it in a later step.
7. Attach 20 and $2 P$

Tip: Do not use adhesive along the bottom of 20 so other pieces can be tucked behind it in a later step.
8. Dovetail and attach prepared $2 Q$ and $2 R$

Tip: Tuck slightly behind 20.
9. Attach photos
10. Attach remaining P2 die cut accents, as shown
11. Embellish with acrylic shapes

Tip: Attach with glue dots.
12. Add journaling
