Getting Started:

- Gather all materials needed.
- Trim all zip strips and set aside. The zip strip is the ½" accent paper along the top of each sheet of patterned paper.
- Check the cut orientation below each cutting guide image. This will show you how to cut the paper, keeping the patterns on your project pieces facing the right direction.
- Light grey pieces on your cutting guide are project pieces. White pieces are leftover paper.
- As you cut the paper, label and sort the pieces as indicated in the cutting guide, creating a stack for each project.
- If there is a fold line present in a cutting diagram, cut the paper first before folding it. In order to die-cut two shapes at once, place the die on top of the folded paper or stack two paper pieces before running the paper through your die-cutting machine. Paper pieces that can be stacked for die-cutting will be labeled, "stack."

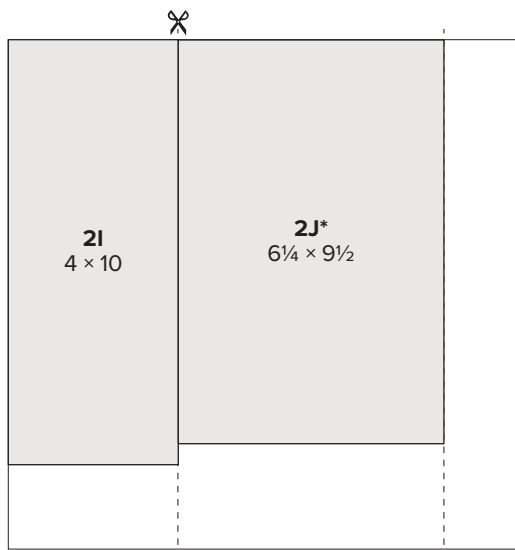

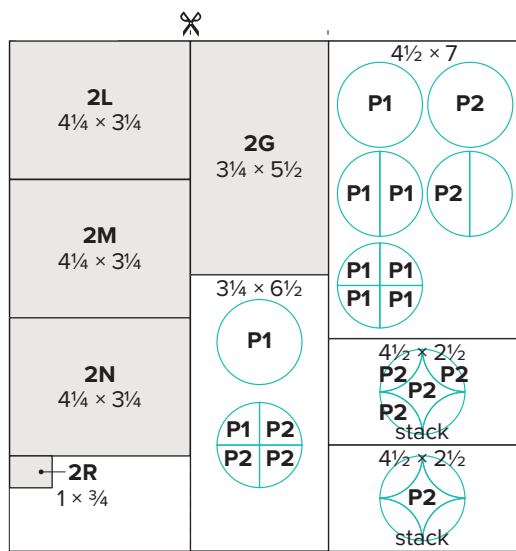
Rosemary cardstock

Lemonade cardstock

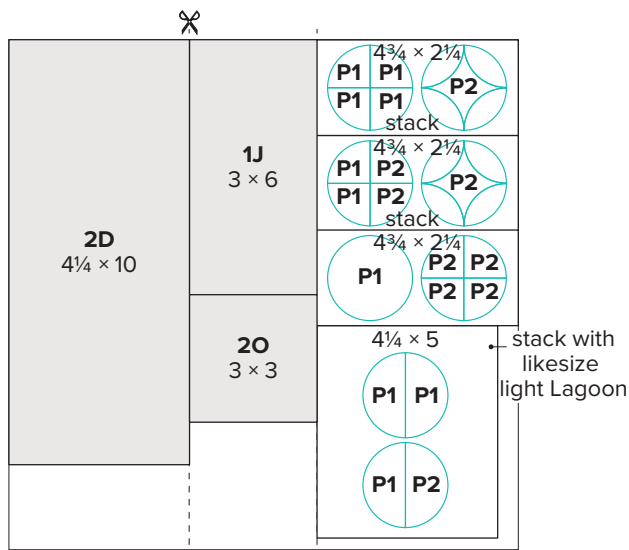

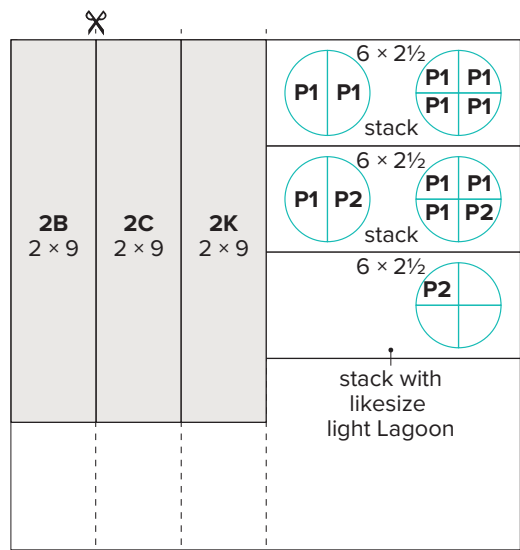
Glacier cardstock

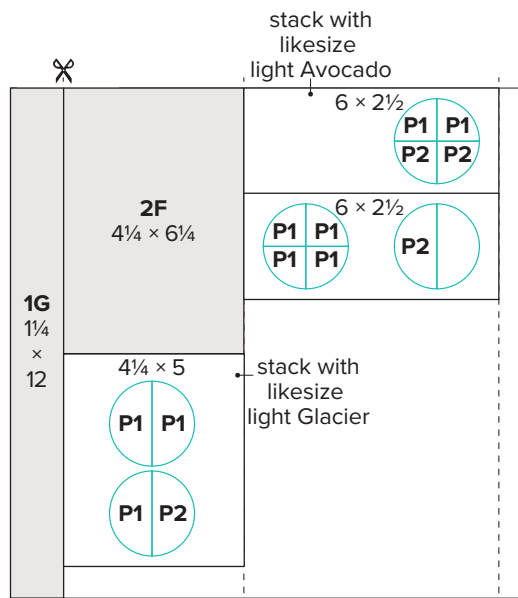
Avocado cardstock

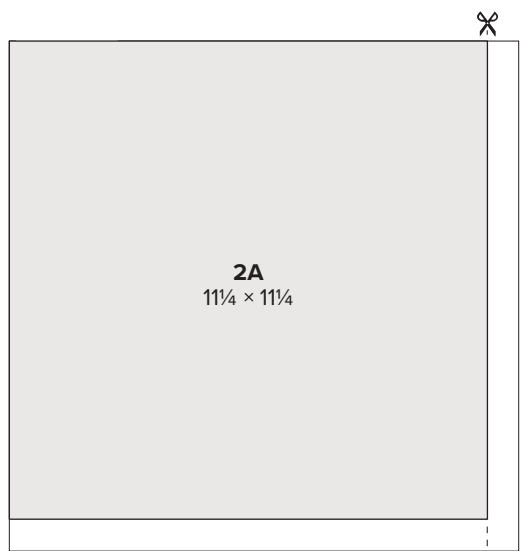

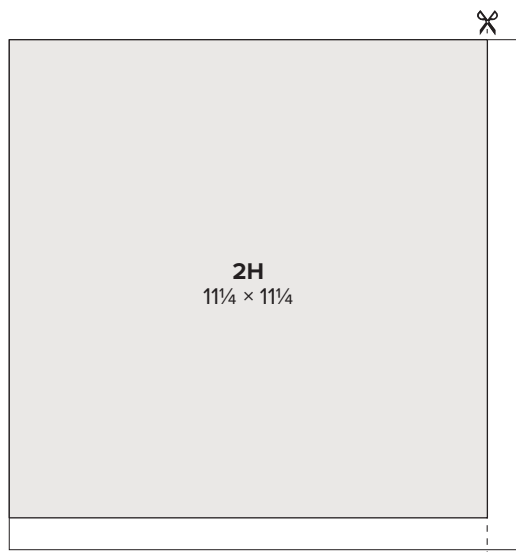

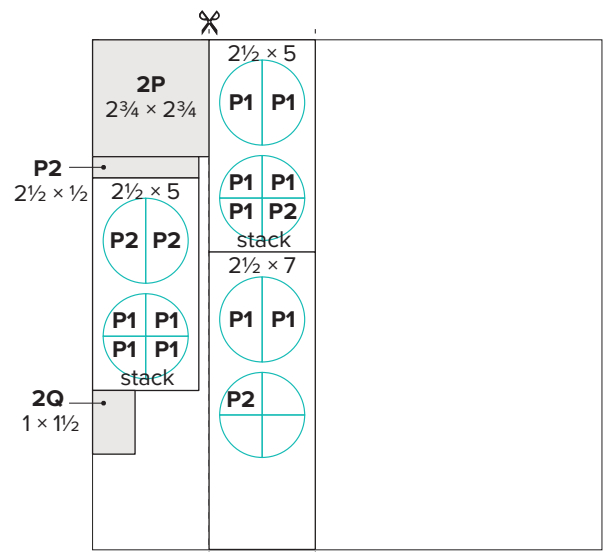


White Daisy cardstock

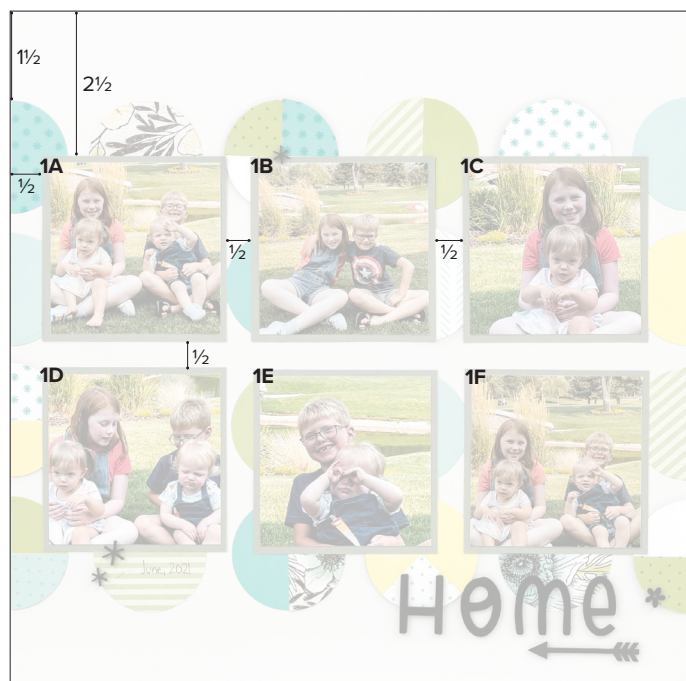

Project 1: Left Page



Prepare (for both pages):

- Stamp patterns on P1 cardstock circle parts with Avocado, Glacier, and Lagoon inks, as shown



- Sponge P1 light Glacier cardstock circle and one quarter circle with Glacier ink

Tip: Cut a wedge out of the round sponge and use it to apply the ink along the edges and in the center of these pieces.
Technique: Gently rub the sponge on the ink pad and then lightly pounce it on the cardstock until the desired amount of colour is achieved.



Assemble:

- Use light Linen cardstock for base page
- Attach P1 circle and circle parts, as shown
Tip: Lay these pieces out before attaching. The circles in each row and column are approximately 1/4" - 3/8" apart.
- Attach 1A, 1B, 1C, 1D, 1E, and 1F
- Attach photos
- Embellish with acrylic shapes
Tip: Attach with glue dots.

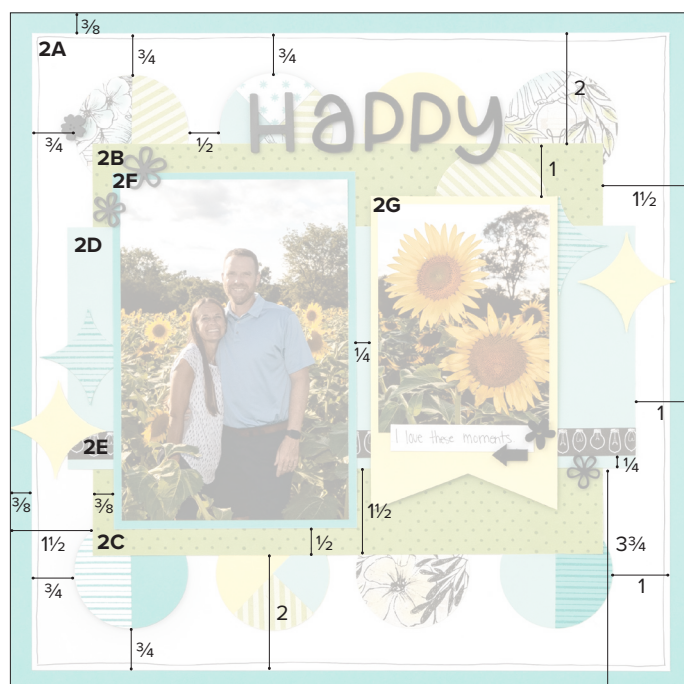
Project 1: Right Page



Assemble:

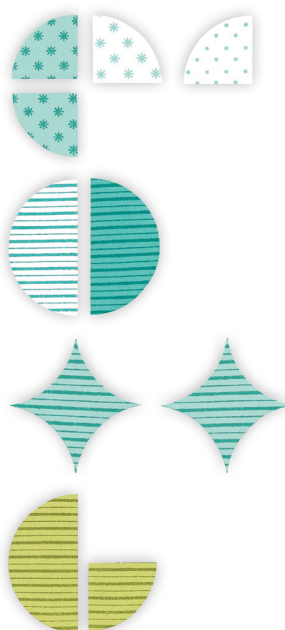
1. Use light Linen cardstock for base page
2. Attach P1 circle parts to form top and bottom rows
Tip: The circles in each column are approximately 1/4" - 3/8" apart.
3. Attach remaining P1 circles and circle parts, as shown.
Tip: Lay these pieces out before attaching, matching the pieces along the left edge with those on the right edge of the left page.
4. Attach 1H to 1G
5. Tear approx. 1/4" off 1G, as shown, and attach
6. Attach 1I
7. Draw stitch lines on 1J with journaling pen, and attach
8. Attach 1K with 3-D foam tape
9. Attach photo
10. Embellish with acrylic shapes
Tip: Attach with glue dots.
11. Add journaling

Project 2: Left Page



Prepare (for both pages):

- Stamp patterns on P2 cardstock circle parts with Avocado, Glacier, and Lagoon inks, as shown



- Stamp polka dot pattern on 2B, 2C, and 2K with Avocado ink, as shown



- Stamp polka dot pattern on 2Q with Glacier ink, as shown



Assemble:

- Use light Lagoon cardstock for base page
- Draw border on 2A with journaling pen, as shown
- Attach 2A
- Attach background P2 circle and circle parts, as shown
Tips: Lay all these pieces out before attaching. The circles in each row are approx. 1/2" apart.
- Attach prepared 2B and 2C
- Attach 2E to 2D
- Attach 2D
- Attach 2F
Tip: Do not use adhesive along the left edge so another piece can be tucked behind it in a later step.
- Dovetail and attach 2G with 3-D foam tape
Tip: Do not use adhesive along the top right corner so another piece can be tucked behind it in a later step.
- Attach remaining P2 die cut accents, as shown
Tip: Tuck a few of these pieces slightly behind 2F and 2G.
- Attach photos
- Embellish with acrylic shapes
Tip: Attach with glue dots.
- Add journaling

Project 2: Right Page



Assemble:

1. Use light Lagoon cardstock for base page
2. Draw border on 2H with journaling pen
3. Attach 2H
4. Attach background P2 circle and circle parts, as shown
Tips: Lay all these out before attaching. The circles in each row are approx. 1/2" apart.
5. Attach 2I, 2J, and prepared 2K
6. Attach 2L, 2M, and 2N with 3-D foam tape
Tip: Do not use adhesive along the top right of 2M so another piece can be tucked behind it in a later step.
7. Attach 2O and 2P
Tip: Do not use adhesive along the bottom of 2O so other pieces can be tucked behind it in a later step.
8. Dovetail and attach prepared 2Q and 2R
Tip: Tuck slightly behind 2O.
9. Attach photos
10. Attach remaining P2 die cut accents, as shown
Tip: Attach with glue dots.
12. Add journaling
