Getting started:

- Gather all materials needed.
- Trim all zip strips and set aside. The zip strip is the 1/2" accent paper along the top of each sheet of patterned paper. Please note that none of the zip strips are used in this workshop.
- Check the cut orientation below each cutting guide image. This will show you how to cut the paper, keeping the patterns on your project pieces facing the right direction.
- As you cut the paper, label and sort the pieces as indicated in the cutting guide, creating a stack for each project.
- If there is a fold line present in a cutting diagram, cut the paper first before folding it. In order to die-cut two shapes at once, place the die on top of the folded paper or stack two paper pieces before running the paper through your die-cutting machine.

P = Project ---- = cut line ---- = fold line



Project I: Best Wishes (Make 4)



Prepare (4 each):

- 1. Stamp 'best WISHES' on the bottom- left corner of 1C with Sapphire ink, as shown.
- 2. Cut the ten 1" white daisy circles (P1) in half. Each card needs 5 half-circles to create the scalloped border.

<u>Tip</u>- To cut a 1" circle in half, put a small amount of tape runner on the back of a circle before placing it right at the top of the paper trimmer. Hold the rail down tightly and cut with a sharp trimmer blade. If any adhesive remains on the trimmer, remove it with the Rub & Remove Eraser.



Assemble:

- 1. Attach 1A.
- 2. Attach 1B at 1" from the top of the card.
- Attach 1C to 1B leaving a small strip of the sapphire cardstock at the top and bottom as shown.
- 4. Attach P1a at ¾" from the top of the card with thin 3-D foam tape.
- 5. Arrange the 5 small white daisy cardstock half-circles (P1) flush with the bottom of 1B to create the scalloped border.
 - <u>Tip</u>: Start by placing the middle half-circle and work out from there to either side of the card. Turn the card over and trim off any of the over-hanging parts of the half-circles so they are flush with the edges of the card.
- 6. Adhere the woodgrain die-cut flowers using the Quickie Glue Pen.
 - <u>Tip</u>- Quickly apply the glue from the Quickie Glue Pen, position the die-cut immediately, hold in place and press firmly to create a permanent bond.

Project 2: Thank You (Make 4)





Prepare (4 each):

- 1. Stamp 'thank YOU' on P2 with sage ink, as shown.
- 2. Ink around the outside of P2 with sage ink using a sponge.

<u>Tip</u>: Cut a wedge out of the round sponge and use it to apply the ink.

<u>Technique</u>: Gently rub the round end of the sponge on the ink pad and then lightly rub it along the edges of the white cardstock circle until the desired amount of colour is achieved.

3. Colour a selection of the woodgrain die-cut flowers with the bright pink triblend marker.

<u>Tip</u>: All three shades of the bright pink marker (light, mid, dark) coordinate well with the pinks featured on the patterned paper in the Flower Shoppe collection. Use your preferred shade to colour the woodgrain die-cuts. The dark shade (BP3) has been used here. <u>Technique</u>: Gently apply the marker on top of the die-cuts to cover the entire surface. You can also colour the edges of the flowers by running the side of the marker along the edges of the die-cuts.

Assemble:

- 1. Attach 2A.
- 2. Attach 2B to the centre of 2A using thin 3-D foam tape.
- 3. Attach 2C to the centre of 2B.
- 4. Attach 2D at ¾" from the bottom of the card.
- 5. Attach P2 with 3-D foam tape.
- Adhere the coloured woodgrain diecut flowers using the Quickie Glue Pen.

<u>Tip-</u> Quickly apply the glue from the Quickie Glue Pen, position the die-cut immediately, hold in place and press firmly to create a permanent bond.

Project 3: Happy Birthday (Make 4)





Prepare (4 each):

- 1. Stamp 'happy BIRTHDAY' towards the bottom of 3E using Sapphire ink, as shown.
- 2. Add doodling with the black pen to 3E.
- 3. Cut the (10) 1" circles in half.
 - <u>Tip-</u> To cut a 1" circle in half, put a small amount of tape runner on the back of a circle before placing it right at the top of the paper trimmer. Hold the rail down tightly and cut with a sharp trimmer blade. If any adhesive remains on the trimmer, remove it with the Rub & Remove Eraser.
- 4. Colour a selection of the woodgrain die-cut flowers with the bright pink triblend marker. <u>Tip</u>: All three shades of the bright pink marker (light, mid, dark) coordinate well with the pinks featured on the patterned paper in the Flower Shoppe collection. Use your preferred shade to colour the woodgrain die-cuts. The dark shade (BP3) has been used here.

<u>Technique</u>: Gently apply the marker on top of the die-cuts to cover the entire surface. You can also colour the edges of the flowers by running the side of the marker along the edges of the die-cuts.

Assemble:

- 1. Attach 3A.
- 2. Attach 3B at 3/8" from the left edge of the card.
- 3. Attach 3C to 3B leaving an even edge on either side.
- 4. Attach 3D at ¾" from the bottom and ¾" from the left side of the card with 3-D foam tape.
- 5. Attach 3E in the centre of 3D.
- 6. Attach the (5) half-circles to 3E with thin 3-D foam tape to create the bunting, as shown.
- 7. Adhere the coloured woodgrain die-cut flowers using the Quickie Glue Pen.
 - <u>Tip</u>- Quickly apply the glue from the Quickie Glue Pen, position the die-cut immediately, hold in place and press firmly to create a permanent bond.

Project 4: Thinking of You (Make 4)



Prepare (4 each):

1. Stamp 'thinking OF YOU' on P4 using sapphire ink.



Assemble:

- 1. Attach 4A to the left side of the card as shown.
- 2. Attach 4C to the right side of the card as shown.
- 3. Centre and attach 4B between 4A and 4C leaving even gaps either side.
- 4. Attach 4D approximately ¾" from the bottom of the card.
- 5. Attach 4E about 1/8" from the bottom of 4D using the Quickie Glue Pen.

 <u>Tip</u>- Quickly apply the glue from the Quickie Glue Pen, position the die-cut immediately, hold in place and press firmly to create a permanent bond.
- 6. Attach P4 with 3-D foam tape.
- 7. Adhere the woodgrain die-cut flowers using the Quickie Glue Pen.
