Getting Started:

- Gather all materials needed.
- Trim all zip strips and set aside. The zip strip is the $\frac{1}{2}$ " accent paper along the top of each sheet of patterned paper.
- · Check the cut orientation below each cutting guide image. This will show you how to cut the paper, keeping the patterns on your project pieces facing the right direction.
- · Light grey pieces on your cutting guide are project pieces. White pieces are leftover paper.
- · As you cut the paper, label and sort the pieces as indicated in the cutting guide, creating a stack for each project.
- In order to die-cut two shapes at once, place the die on top of two stacked paper pieces before running the paper through your diecutting machine. Paper pieces that can be stacked for die-cutting will be labeled, "stack."



Paper: White Daisy Inks: Intense Black, Mist, Mulberry,

Seabrook

Tips: Once the outline is dry, color the stamped frog using the stamp pad painting technique. The frog is painted in Seabrook and shaded in Mist. The lips and cheeks are painted with Mulberry. The eyes are Mist.

Technique: Squeeze the closed stamp pad in the center to transfer some ink to the inside lid. Open the pad and use the inked lid as a tray to paint from.



- 1. Prepare pieces shown above
- 2. Attach 1A, prepared 1B, and prepared 1C
- 3. Attach 1D
- 4. Attach prepared 1E with 3-D foam tape
- 5. Color acrylic stars with lightest Coral Shades blend marker, let dry
- 6. Embellish with prepared acrylic stars *Tip: Attach with glue dots.*






2C:Paper: light Seabrook
Inks: Intense Black, Seabrook
Tip: Dovetail.



2E:Paper: White Daisy
Ink: Mulberry
Tip: Add color with a blending brush.
Technique: Load the brush with ink
by rubbing the bristles on the ink
pad. Apply the ink to the cardstock
using a gentle circular motion.



- 1. Prepare pieces shown above
- 2. Attach 2A
- 3. Attach 2B and prepared 2C
- 4. Attach 2D with 3-D foam tape
- 5. Attach prepared 2E
- 6. Attach P2 gold glitter paper crown accent to 2E, as shown *Tip: Use the glue pen.*
- 7. Color acrylic stars with lightest Coral Shades blend marker, let dry
- 8. Embellish with prepared acrylic stars *Tip: Attach with glue dots.*


Prepare (4):





3C:Paper: White Daisy Inks: Intense Black, Mist, Mulberry, Seabrook Tips: Once the outline is dry, color the stamped frog using the stamp pad painting technique. The frog is painted in Seabrook and shaded in Mist. The cheeks are painted with Mulberry. The eyes are Mist.

Technique: Squeeze the closed stamp pad in the center to transfer some ink to the inside lid. Open the pad and use the inked lid as a tray to paint from.



- 1. Prepare piece shown above
- 2. Attach 3A
- 3. Attach 3B with 3-D foam tape
- 4. Attach prepared 3C
- 5. Tear ends off 3D, approx. $\ensuremath{\mbox{\%}}\xspace$ ", and attach as shown
- 6. Color acrylic stars with lightest Coral Shades blend marker, let dry
- 7. Embellish with prepared acrylic stars *Tip: Attach with glue dots.*

4D:

Paper: light Seabrook
Inks: Intense Black, Seabrook
Tips: Add color to the center, first,
with Seabrook ink and a blending
brush. Then, stamp with black.
Technique: Load the brush with ink
by rubbing the bristles on the ink
pad. Apply the ink to the cardstock
using a gentle circular motion.



- 1. Prepare piece shown above
- 2. Attach 4A, 4B, and 4C
- 3. Attach prepared 4D
- 4. Attach P4 gold glitter paper crown accents to prepared 4D, as shown
- Color acrylic stars with lightest Coral Shades blend marker, let dry
- 6. Embellish with prepared acrylic stars *Tip: Attach with glue dots.*
