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Getting Started:

- · Gather all materials needed.
- Trim all zip strips and set aside. The zip strip is the ½" accent paper along the top of each sheet of patterned paper.
- Light grey pieces on your cutting guide are project pieces. White pieces are leftover paper.
- As you cut your paper, label and sort the pieces as indicated in the cutting guide, creating a stack for each project.
- If there is a fold line present in a cutting diagram, cut the paper first before folding it. In order to die-cut two shapes at once, place the die on top of the folded paper or stack two paper pieces before running the paper through your die-cutting machine. Paper pieces that can be stacked for die-cutting will be labeled, "stack."

Card Base:

Ink: Tattered Rose
Tip: Add the ink with a blending tool,
as shown. Set aside to dry.

Paper: Paprika Ink: Paprika



1C:

Paper: light Mink
Die: stitched border
Tips: Use washi tape to hold the
Thin Cuts die in place while running
the paper through your die-cutting
machine. Dovetail the bottom.



P1 Accent:

Paper: White Daisy Die: small bouquet Inks: Flamingo, New England Ivy, Paprika

Tips: Stamp the two smallest flowers using the second-generation stamping technique.

Technique: Ink the stamp and stamp it on a scratch piece of paper. Then, without re-inking, stamp on the accent.

Assemble:

- 1. Prepare pieces shown above
- 2. Attach 1A and 1B
- 3. Attach 1C and 1D
- 4. Attach bouquet accent with 3-D foam tape, as shown
- 5. Stamp "Thanks You're the best" with Archival Black or Black ink, as shown
- 6. Embellish with dots



Assemble:

- 2. Attach 2A and 2B
- 3. Dovetail 2C, and attach

- 5. Stamp "THINKING OF YOU" on 2B with Archival Black or Black ink, as shown
- 6. Attach 2E
- 7. Attach bouquet accent with 3-D foam tape, as shown
- 8. Embellish with dots

Paper: White Daisy Ink: Tattered Rose Tips: Add the ink with a blending tool, as shown. Set aside to dry.



P3 Accent:

Paper: White Daisy Die: floral border Inks: Flamingo, New England Ivy,

Paprika

Tip: Stamp the flower on the far right using the second-generation stamping technique. Technique: Ink the stamp in Flamingo and stamp it on a scratch piece of paper. Then, without re-inking, stamp on the accent.

FOLD 3F 3G 3E **3C** 3B 3D 11/4 **3A**

Assemble:

- 1. Prepare pieces shown above
- 2. Attach 3A, 3B, and 3C
- 3. Dovetail 3D and 3E, and attach
- 4. Stamp "x" border above 3E with Paprika ink, as shown
- 5. Stamp "Thanks" with Archival Black or Black ink on 3F, as shown
- 6. Attach 3F and 3G
- 7. Attach flower accent with 3-D foam tape, as shown
- 8. Embellish with dots

Paper: White Daisy Inks: Archival Black or Black, Tattered Rose

Tips: Add the Tattered Rose Distress Oxide™ ink first, with a blending tool, as shown. Let the ink dry before stamping the sentiment using

selective inking.

Technique: Carefully apply Archival Black or Black ink to "THINKING" and stamp on 4C, as shown. Clean the stamp, then, carefully apply Archival Black or Black ink to "OF YOU" and stamp on 4C, as shown.



P4 Accent:

Paper: White Daisy Die: floral border

Inks: New England Ivy, Paprika,

Tattered Rose

Tips: Add the Tattered Rose Distress Oxide™ ink first, with a blending tool, as shown. Let the ink dry before stamping the flowers. (Make 2 per card.)



- 1. Prepare pieces shown above
- 2. Attach 4A and 4B
- 3. Attach 4C with 3-D foam tape
- 4. Tear both ends of 4D and attach, as shown
- 5. Attach floral accents with 3-D foam tape, as shown
- 6. Embellish with dots
